Recent developments include:

e have arrived at a new working relationship, beginning September 2002, with Burnaby Girls Soccer

Club between respective pee wee members. Initially, we will have monthly once scheduled games, between alternating Burnaby and West Van fields for our U8, U9 and U10 girls. We also have friendship tournaments planned for our U11 players.

For U6 and U7 girls, we will plan small four-aside games once a month, to be played in the Burnaby Eight Rinks indoor soccer facility alongside our new U6-U7 program which will run from September through March. We will continue our relationship with North Shore Girls Club as well.

In another important development, WV Girls will now have the ability to form our own Metro level teams, from U14 and up. There are many reasons for this development, but primarily we believe that it is called for by the fast growing popularity of girls soccer in West Vancouver and the technical direction of our club head coach.

Our club will continue to develop more players and offer them the opportunity to play at the highest level within our club framework.

Fields: Demand on our fields is increasing and many are already overused. We play almost 2000 games a year on our fields, not including tournaments, make up games and cup playdowns. Our club has been working very hard

this year to lay out a framework to create new fields and refurbish our existing ones. With many thanks to the cooperation of West Van Parks, we are on the verge of having a new artificial turf field developed.

From this point on we will need all hands on deck to help the process and achieve our goal. The money has been allocated. We are working on the location, but we need all of our members help. Further details will be sent out shortly.

The North Shore Premier Player Program

The North Shore Boys' Clubs by Ken Savage, President

his preliminary letter is to inform you about an exciting new North Shore District soccer development program for boys that will begin to operate on the North Shore in the 2002-03 season: the North Shore Premier Player Program.

What is the North Shore Premier Player Program?

The North Shore Premier Player Program is a soccer development program that is open to boys U13-U14 who are registered to play soccer for one of the North Shore District clubs during the 2002-03 season and have been

chosen for one of their club select teams (Gold and Silver level). A secondary focus of the Program will be district competitive play that fits in with the soccer development goals of the program and does not conflict with club select team play. In the immediate future this will take the form of tournament and exhibition play, and perhaps out-of-regular season league play. Eventually it may be possible to find opportunities for

more regular league play for a district team in-season that does not conflict with players' club commitments. In future years the program will also be open to U15-U18 players, and possibly also U12 players.

How Does the Program Fit In With the Current Metro Program?

North Shore Premier Player Program is designed to replace current Metro program. In the 2002-2003 season it will replace the Metro program only at U14; but in subsequent years it will gradually replace the Metro program in other age-groups, as the current group of Metro players move on beyond youth soccer. Our conviction is that North Shore Premier Player Program offers the best opportunity for the top players in all age-groups on the North Shore to develop as soccer players.

How Do I Enter the Program?

Entry into the Program will be via ID camps at each age-group, to be held in late August/early September 2002. Selection into NSPPP will be based mainly on

quality, commitment, and teachability. Once identified, a player will become part of a district development squad will be invited both to development squad sessions competitive games. and to Attendance at development sessions will not be mandatory in order to play in competitive games as long as the player is already receiving good soccer development in other designated environments of recognizable quality, which will be determined by the North Shore Premier Player Program committee.

How Do I Remain in the Program?

Continued participation by a player in the Program will be dependent not only upon continued commitment to the program, but on a continuing excellent attitude and commitment level to the player's club team. Each player accepted into the Program will The North Shore clubs will organize the practice times for their U13 and U14 club teams in such a way that there is no conflict between these practices and development squad sessions.

What Do I Need to Do Now?

There is nothing that you need to do now, except to try out for your club select teams at the club tryouts. A further letter will be sent to all North Shore U13 and U14 players in a few months time that will give more precise details about the ID camps and the Program.


